B_____ Authority

Α

The Bible is the final authority in all matters of belief and practice because the Bible is inspired by God and bears the absolute authority of God Himself. 2 Timothy 3:15-17; 1 Thessalonians 2:13; 2 Peter 1:20, 21

_____ of the Local Church

The local church is an independent body accountable to the Lord Jesus Christ, the head of the church. All human authority for governing the local church resides within the local church itself. Thus, the church is autonomous, or self-governing. Colossians 1:18; 2 Corinthians 8:1-5, 19, 23

P_____ of the Believer

Every believer is a priest of God and may enter into His presence in prayer directly through our Great High Priest, Jesus Christ. No other mediator is needed between God and people. We all have equal access to God. 1 Peter 2:5, 9; Revelation 5:9, 10

T____ Ordinances

The local church should practice two ordinances: (1) baptism of believers by immersion in water, identifying the individual with Christ in His death, burial, and resurrection, and (2) the Lord's Supper, or communion, commemorating His death for our sins. Matthew 28:19, 20; 1 Corinthians 11:23-32

Soul Liberty

Every individual, whether a believer or an unbeliever, has the liberty to choose what he believes is right in the religious realm. However, this liberty does not exempt one from responsibility to the Word of God or from accountability to God Himself. Romans 14:5, 12; 2 Corinthians 4:2; Titus 1:9

S_____, Baptized Church Membership

Local church membership is restricted to individuals who give a believable testimony of personal faith in Christ and have publicly identified themselves with Him in believer's baptism. Acts 2:41-47; 1 Corinthians 12:12; 2 Corinthians 6:14; Ephesians 4:3

T_____Offices

The Bible mandates only two offices in the church, pastor and deacon. The terms, *pastor*, *elder*, *bishop*, or *overseer*, all refer to the same office. 1 Timothy 3:1-13; Acts 20:17-38; Philippians 1:1

S_____ of Church and State

God established both the church and the civil government, and He gave each its distinct sphere of operation. The government's purposes are outlined in Romans 13:1-7 and the church's purposes in Matthew 28:19-20.

Neither should control the other nor should there be an alliance between them. Matthew 22:15-22; Acts 15:17-29



OUR BELIEFS

Calvary Baptist Church is a Christian church, so we look to the Bible and the teachings of Jesus Christ for the foundation of what we believe.

Here is a look into some of our ESSENTIAL BELIEFS:

About God

There is one and only one living and true God. The eternal triune God reveals Himself to us as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, with distinct personal attributes, but without division of nature, essence, or being.

About God the Father

God, as Father, reigns with providential care over His universe, His creatures, and the flow of the stream of human history according to the purposes of His grace.

About God the Son

Jesus Christ is the eternal Son of God. In His incarnation as Jesus Christ, He was conceived of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. He honored the divine law by His personal obedience, and in His substitutionary death on the cross and resurrection from the dead He made provision for the redemption of men from sin.

About God the Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit is the Spirit of God, fully divine. He exalts Christ. He convicts men of sin, of righteousness, and of judgment. He enlightens and empowers the believer and the church in worship, evangelism, and service.

About the Scriptures

The Holy Bible was written by men divinely inspired and is God's revelation of Himself to man. It is a perfect treasure of divine instruction. It has God for its author, salvation for its end, and truth without any mixture of error for its matter.

About Salvation

Salvation involves the redemption of the whole man and is offered freely to all who accept Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior, who by His own blood obtained eternal redemption for the believer. In its broadest sense, salvation includes regeneration, justification, sanctification, and glorification. There is no salvation apart from personal faith in Jesus Christ as Lord

About the Church

A New Testament church is a local autonomous body of believers who are associated by their common faith and fellowship with Jesus Christ. It is the desire of every member to protect the unity, share the responsibility, serve the ministry, and support the life of the church.

About Evangelism

It is the responsibility of every Christian to share the Good News with those God has brought us into contact. We practice personally sharing about Christ and inviting friends to church.

GIVING OUR BEST



At Calvary, in addition to large worship gatherings, we have smaller **GROUPS** for all ages where we get to know one another and apply God's Word.

Groups at Calvary take on two main identities:

Many Groups meet on Sunday mornings and Wednesday evenings, others also meet on other days, at various locations in the community, and at homes to learn about and discuss specific books or topics of the Bible.

• Agape Groups & Fire Teams. These groups are smaller, 3-4 person, same-gender, groups meeting weekly in-person or online for support and encouragement.

A BIT OF CALVARY'S HISTORY



Calvary Baptist Church was established in 1971 by a small group of Baptists who felt a strong commitment to the Great Commission.

Calvary's early ministries included medical outreach and evangelism at the US/Mexico border, along with a dedication to reaching young families and children in Bastrop County. Several building projects would provide much-needed additional space for growing ministries.

The Bastrop Campus building was renovated in 2017 to host adult groups and the ever-expanding children and student ministries. Additionally, a new auditorium was built to host multiple Sunday services for both classic and modern worship styles. In October of 2018, Calvary's Spanish language service, *Calvario*, was launched.

Outreach and missions have remained a central focus as Calvary has continued to be one of the most giving churches in the state both denominationally and as a disaster relief center. In addition to several local and state mission affiliates, international mission partnerships are developing to focus on unengaged and unreached people groups.

Calvary's vision for local kingdom growth has been focused on outreach and multi-campus expansion. This began with the launch of the Smithville campus in August of 2020 – at the height of the COVID Pandemic.

The future may bring many changes, but God's word remains the same and Calvary Baptist Church will continue to point people to Jesus by *Demonstrating* God's Love, *Declaring* the Good News, And Making *Disciples* Near and Far.

HOW IS CALVARY ORGANIZED?

Calvary is an autonomous and democratic church operating under the Lordship of Jesus Christ and the leadership of the Holy Spirit. Every member plays a part, and some are chosen to manage the parts. No outside entity controls Calvary, but we recognize and sustain mutual counsel and cooperation among like-minded churches through organizations such as the Baptists of Texas Convention, the International Mission Board, and other local and international ministries.

The Church Council leads matters of direction, doctrine, and discipline. The Council may recruit and establish teams and delegate authority to qualified individuals to assist in their duties. The Church Council and all Church Officers are responsible for ensuring transparency in managing church business and regularly informing the Church Body of important issues and decisions.

VOTING:

Each member, age 17 and older, is entitled to one vote, and a simple majority shall prevail in deciding all business unless otherwise provided for in the Church Constitution and By-Laws. Specific items requiring a vote are available upon request.



CHURCH OFFICERS AND THEIR RESPONSIBILITIES:

- The Church Council is responsible for the overall direction and spiritual vision of the church. They work with the Lead Pastor to lead and oversee the church. They ensure all business is conducted with transparency, recommend members to fill officer positions, present discipline issues to the church, determine theological positions, and oversee the Management Team and Deacon Body. Council members serve three-year renewable terms as elected by the church membership.
- The Lead Pastor and Pastoral Staff lead church vision, preaching and teaching, and equipping members for ministry. The Lead Pastor oversees the church staff.
- The Deacon Body cares for the physical and spiritual needs of the membership. They protect the unity of the church, oversee benevolence and visitation ministries, assist in administration of ordinances, and pray and counsel with members. Deacons serve three-year renewable terms as elected by the church membership.
- The Management Team cares for the monetary and physical resources of the church, including procedures, budget development, and assisting in all areas of finance, facilities, legal, non-pastoral personnel, and technology.
- The Trustees are the legal representatives of the church as required by the State.

MEMBERSHIP WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE A MEMBER OF CALVARY – OR ANY CHURCH?

What church membership does NOT mean:

- Church membership does NOT grant you a ticket to heaven.
- Church membership does NOT even guarantee you are a Christian.

Only repenting of your sins and placing your faith in Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord guarantees you are a Christian.

However, church membership should require that at some point in the past you put your faith in Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord.





Becoming a member of Calvary Baptist Church means that you support the Mission, Core Values, Beliefs, Vision, and Leadership of Calvary. It also empowers you to be a part of determining how best to fulfill that mission and vision.

The vision God has given the leadership of Calvary may differ from other churches. This does not necessarily make Calvary "right" and all others "wrong". It means God uses each of us a little differently. By becoming a member of Calvary, you are proclaiming that you want to be a part of reaching your community and the world in the way God is leading Calvary and you will support Calvary with your hands, feet, voice, time, money, and especially your prayers.

The following pages introduce three qualifications for becoming a member of the Calvary Family.

WHAT ARE THE *QUALIFICATIONS* FOR CBC MEMBERSHIP?

THE FIRST QUALIFICATION is a public profession of faith. This simply means that upon hearing and understanding the Gospel message that you have repented of your sins and placed your faith in Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord, and that you have told others about this decision.

"Therefore, everyone who will acknowledge me before others, I will also acknowledge him before my Father in heaven."

MATTHEW 10:32

"Repenting of your sins" means that you admit that you are a sinner, and believe that Jesus shed His blood, died, and rose again to pay for your sins.

"Placing your faith in Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord" means that not only have you accepted what Jesus did on the cross, but that you are turning all aspects of your life over to Him, for the rest of your life. You now live in a relationship with Jesus in which every choice and every decision you make will be done in a way that is guided by and honoring of Him.

This is not a ritual based upon any specific words or prayers, but rather, a willful decision and sincere step of faith that leads to a life that is observably changed and generates a strong desire to grow as a disciple.

Paul explains this in his letter to the Roman people, and we can highlight this process with the following scriptures, often referred to as *The Romans Road...*

- ROMANS 3:23 *"For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God"*. Even just one sin separates us from our relationship with God and eternity in Heaven.
- ROMANS 5:8 "But God proves his own love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." Because God loves us, He has taken the initiative to rectify the relationship.
- ROMANS 6:23 "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." No matter what we try, because of our sin, we cannot restore the relationship and are destined for death, eternal separation from God. But God provided a perfect sacrifice, a bridge Jesus Christ. By accepting the gift of Jesus through faith in who He is and what He's done, the relationship can be restored, and we can be eternally with God.
- ROMANS 10:9 "If you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved." We must not only understand and believe God's plan, but we must verbalize it to others and act upon it. Our actions validate our faith.

This process is often called being "born again." It's a spiritual birth into a restored relationship with God.

"Jesus replied, "Truly I tell you, unless someone is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God."

JOHN 3:3

If you have not yet done this, we invite you to do it now. Repent of your sins, place your faith in Jesus, and tell someone right away. You can pray right now; admit you are a sinner, believe Jesus is God's gift, that He died and rose again. Place your faith in Him as Lord and Savior over everything in your life.

Now, tell someone!

THE SECOND QUALIFICATION is that you follow or have followed up this faith and confession with baptism. Baptism is another action that validates our faith. It is both exemplified and commanded by Jesus Christ (MATTHEW 3:13-16; 28:18-19).

Baptism is a symbolic profession, much like a wedding ring. The ring doesn't make you married, but it is symbolic that you are. You're telling everyone, "The old life is gone, my new life has come" (2 CORINTHIANS 5:17). Similarly, baptism is a symbolic profession of our newfound faith, an act of obedience following the example and command of our Savior and Lord.

If you have just decided to accept Jesus as Savior and Lord, or you've made this decision in the past but haven't yet followed it with baptism, now is the time! Joyfully make this declaration of your salvation to the church so that we can all proclaim glory to God for what he has done in your heart.

A couple more things about baptism:


- Biblically, baptism only follows a person's decision and confession to accept Jesus as Savior and Lord. Therefore, baptisms before decisions may be well-intentioned but are not professions.
- Biblically, baptism is done by immersion. The Greek word means "fully sunk". We choose to follow the Biblical example and as a reflection of Jesus' burial and resurrection; fully dying to self and raised to new life as a devoted disciple of Jesus Christ (COLOSSIANS 2:12-14).

THE THIRD QUALIFICATION is that you agree with our Essential Beliefs. Again, some of these beliefs are listed on pages 14 and 15. A more thorough examination of our beliefs is posted on our website.






